1. Spelling practice: Prefixes: A prefix is a word part that is added to the beginning of a base word. A prefix changes the meaning of a word. For example: The prefix *bene* – means “good”. The prefix “mal- means” *bad*” Adding *mal-* to the base word *treat* makes *maltreat*, which means “to be treated badly”

Add a prefix to each word below. Write a word that adds the meaning of “bad” or “badly” To each word. Adjusted, formed, practice, content, nutrition. Also, find meaning to these prefixes. Benefactor, beneficial, beneficiary, benevolent, malice. Make sentences with them.
